

Coleby Defib

At the April meeting, the council selected a supplier, and a grant application has been sent into NLC to help with the cost of the purchase. Please watch the noticeboards, social media and the council web page for progress.

SPEEDING SIGN (SID)

At last, \circ we have a SID in place. Our thanks go to NLC for their generous community grant of £3500 towards the purchase of the sign and poles. The sign is currently situated on the Whitton Road entrance to West Halton. The sign is battery powered (re-chargeable) so when the battery has run down, the PC will remove the sign, install a replacement charged battery and then re-locate the sign to a different pole. Data and statistics are now being collected from the sign and these will be available on the parish council web site, this newsletter and on the noticeboards. The first indications are that 75% of drivers actually do adhere to the limit in this area, but this means that 25% do not. One record shows a speed detected of 75mph!!. The statistics will be examined monthly – Lets determine just how fast some of these drivers go and see if these signs act as deterrents. Some inconsiderate people will continue to speed however all we can do is try to mitigate the impact as much as possible.



PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

After the flooding in January 2024, the PC contacted the LLFA at NLC. The Lead Local Flood Authority was established after the 2007 flooding and their remit is to carry out flood investigations. A team visited West Halton 7th March, and met with the councillors and local residents. Several areas were inspected; Walker Close, Water Lane and Coleby Road (adjacent to the Cemetery). The first inspection was of the drains in Walker Close. These drains have been poorly maintained for years and one is blocked by a broken drain rod stuck inside it!. The LLFA helped to contact Ongo and establish ownership. In late March a large tanker spent all day jetting and cleaning the drains down White House Lane and in Walker Close, with Water Lane being next on the list. Early April will see more work taking place on Coleby road, outside the Old Rectory. The PC are busy mapping the water catchment areas of West Halton Beck, and putting together a model, along with photos to illustrate what happens when Water Lane and Coleby Road floods. This will be presented to the LLFA to help with their further investigations.

2nd May 2024 18.30 West Halton Village Hall is the date for the Annual Parish Assembly. This is where the Parish Council report back to the electorate on its activities during the last year and what activities it has planned for the new financial year. This meeting is an opportunity for parishioners to come along and speak to the council in a more informal setting. Everyone is welcome.

The Annual Parish Assembly is followed by the Annual Parish Council meeting, at which the officers of Chair and Vice Chair are elected.

The council are pleased to announce that we were successful in our 'In Bloom' application. The Council were awarded a total of £435.00. This will go towards the purchase of 3 new wood planters and plants for the new and existing planters. NLC are encouraging all councils to use more sustainable planting such as grasses, evergreens and perennials so the council will shop around and find the best deals. Some summer bedding will also be purchased to provide that bright summer splurge of colour

The last patch of ivy along Churchside wall is proving to be extremely troublesome to remove. The team have been out at the end of February however some of the ivy has turned into tree trunks, so we need to get some stronger kit to help us. Once we have some better weather the intrepid band of volunteers will be out again, hopefully this time completing the task.

Sometimes it is necessary to spray the ivy and weeds to keep them under control. The PC usually use an environmentally friendly mix of vinegar, salt and washing up liquid, however sometimes a proprietary weed killer is utilised. The PC only use off the shelf weed killers; ones which are readily available to everyone for purchase and when applying we are extra careful.

ST ETHELDREDAS CHURCH

Sadly, we have had to take the decision to remove one of the sycamore trees within the churchyard. After the large branch fell off, it was found that the remainder of the tree was totally unstable and could potentially fall onto the church. LA Tree Surgeons came along and did a fantastic, skilled job of removing the remaining tree.

Once the work has been completed safely, the wood will be made the available to villagers. In return we kindly ask for a donation toward the costs the church has incurred. Please look out for the notices advising when the wood will be available
