The consultation will be presented by Camargue UK, a company based in Cheltenham. The consultation event will present the Northern Endurance Partnership's (NEP's) new DCO application for the Humber Carton Capture Pipeline. This is an onshore CO₂ transportation pipeline from Drax in North Yorkshire to Easington in the East Riding of Yorkshire.

This event will enable the local communities time to study the Governments proposed carbon capture pipeline and for the residents to express their views on the proposal, whether they are directly or indirectly affected by this new underground transportation.

Flooded footpath

The footpath at the bottom of Winteringham Lane has been impassable for many months due to flooding. The issue was raised with NLC around 7 months ago. NLC have been waiting for the footpath to dry out so that a boardwalk can be installed. As the path is now passable the PC are pushing hard to get the boardwalk installed as the council know many people enjoy using this path.

SSL Certification We now have our SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) certificate in place so when people visit our web page you can be sure that the site is safe. Please do visit the site for all PC minutes, agendas and news

The Whitton road planter was unfortunately damaged in a road traffic accident back in January. A price has been obtained to repair the planter and to re-site it back on the concrete base. The PC hope to have this work finished by the end of August.

Coleby Defib

At the time of writing, the PC is still awaiting a decision on the community grant application. The application was submitted to NLC Mid-May with a decision promised by the end of May/beginning of June. The PC are **extremely** frustrated with the amount of time this is taking so the clerk has requested the assistance of the local ward councillors to escalate the issue with NLC as the PC recognise that a defib is a vital community asset.

LLFA (Lead Local Flood Authority)

We mentioned in the April newsletter, that the LLFA established ownership of the Walker Close drain. The PC are pleased to report that work has taken place. The pipe in which the drain rod was stuck has been removed, and a new pipe and soakaway have been installed. Hopefully this will resolve the issue of flooding in Walker Close. Only time and the weather will tell!

The PC have been busy mapping the branch of West Halton beck, which runs behind Glebe Farm and parallel with Coleby road. Maps and photos will now be sent to the LLFA to help them with their investigations. A new culvert has been installed on Coleby Road, opposite the cemetery and highways are due to inspect the metal grill/old culvert on Coleby Road to determine what work is needed in this area.

Council members will now carry out the same mapping exercise on the branch of West Halton beck which runs towards

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Winteringham Lane

The PC recognise that Winteringham Lane is in a shocking state. Weeds are growing alongside the kerbed areas, the footpaths are barely discernible and some of the hedges are over hanging the footpaths making it virtually impossible to walk along the pathways. The PC are investigating organisations who could possibly assist with cleaning up this area. NLC road sweeper has visited West Halton recently, however it seems that they do not even think about coming down Winteringham Lane!!

Village Field wall repairs

The council have allocated a further £2000 in the 2024-2025 budget to cover the cost of repairing another section of the village field wall. The PC are presently holding off on this project, as, some of these funds may have to be utilised to provide more mapping information relating to the flooding incidents. Once all the mapping has taken place the PC will be in a better position to scrutinise what funds can be used against which projects

Have you spotted a bike?

There were 3 bikes hiding away in the Village Hall loft, rusting away and un-loved, from the days when various professional cycles races passed through.

After some TLC involving the attaching of a wicker basket and plant box to each cycle along with a lick of paint, the bikes are now on display around West Halton with their wicker baskets and boxes planted up. Many thanks go out to the residents who worked on these.

Verge grass cutting

Last year due to a funding deficit only 7 cuts were possible. The PC have negotiated with NLC and we are delighted to say that we have received additional funding toward devolved grass cutting, the first payment being received at the beginning of July. This means that our contractor will be able to cut the verges a total of 8 times during the season. The PROW will be cut 3 times. The PC does recognise that there is a 'silent band' of community spirited residents who regularly cut areas of highways verges at their own expense and in their own time. Our thanks go out to these people who help to keep West Halton and Coleby looking so lovely during the summer months.

Mystery of the disappearing streetlight

When Northern Power Gen recently installed the new electric transformer in White House Lane, it became apparent that the streetlight had been taken down and not replaced. After lengthy consultations with NLC, we now have installed a brand new fully functioning streetlight.

Ivy Clearance

The team have completed the clearing of the ivy off the village wall. There are 2 areas along Churchside which have been left as it is just impossible to remove these by hand.

Once the PC have established how to proceed with the wall repairs in this area, these 2 areas will be tackled. In the meantime, growth will be kept under control.
