#### LLFA (Lead Local Flood Authority) update

Maps and photos have been sent to the LLFA team of the branch of West Halton Beck that runs towards Alkborough. The new culvert installed outside the Old Rectory seemed to cope better with the recent rain. We will monitor this throughout the Autumn and Winter.

The PC will continue to press NLC and LLFA for feedback and possible solutions to flooding issues.

We do have a small stock of sandbags in storage in the event of any future flooding issues. These are kept in the shed in the village hall car park and are available to all residents

#### **Arnold Clark Grant funding**

Due to a successful grant application, Arnold Clark have kindly provided £200 towards the purchase of perennials and shrubs. These are to be planted alongside the village hall wall, adjacent to the kissing gate off Coleby road. Check out their web site for car bargains!

Many, many thanks to the Coleby resident for allowing the unit to be installed on their property. In 2025 the PC will investigate the feasibility of installing a second defib in West Halton

### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### **Village Field Car Park**

Ideas are being drawn up for a re-vamp of the village field car park. These may include a low wood boundary fence to enclosing the parking area and possibly a height barrier at the entrance. We are looking at the feasibility of leaving the barrier open more often, especially during summer months, to allow families and footballers an area in which to park, thus avoiding cars being parked on grass verges and down streets.

#### **Community Pay Back**

The Community Pay Back (CPB) teams have visited West Halton twice. Their first task was to clear Winteringham Lane of all the grass and weeds growing alongside the kerbstones, cut and re-define footpath boundaries and to trim back overhanging hedges. The teams worked solid for one day during July and the results are outstanding. One comment from a resident was 'I didn't know we had such a wide footpath down there!'

The second visit was on 14<sup>th</sup> September. This time the team strimmed around the village field boundary, cleaned the play area and around the bases of the trees. They did another excellent job and many, **many** thanks go to the residents who removed the 13 bags of rubbish created

#### **Field Cutting**

As of the end of 2024, our current contractor has decided not to renew the grass field cutting contract with the PC. As most people probably know, Adrian has been cutting the field on a regular basis, along with the cemetery. People will have seen him bustling along on the field with his grass cutting tractor. Sadly, Adrian has decided to hang up his cutters so, at the time of writing, the PC are issuing tenders to new contractors. We are sure that everyone would like to thank Adrian for his commitment and hard work over the years in helping to keep our field and cemetery areas tidy

#### **Community Pay Back (3)**

A third visit is planned for w/c 14<sup>th</sup> October. This time the teams will tackle the overgrown area behind the village hall and the remainder of the trees at the northern end of the village field.

#### Village field wall repair

Our contractor will shortly be repairing another section of the village field wall. The PC are constantly monitoring the ivy and weed growth to ensure that vegetation does not take over again
