### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

#### **Flooding**

West Halton once again was subjected to considerable flooding in January. The Council already has cases open with the relevant authorities, including the LLFA (Local Lead Flood Agency) and we want to assure residents we will keep pressure on these organisations until a suitable solution is found. In the meantime, when any future flooding occurs, please will residents to take photographs, note dates and times and send the information to the Parish Clerk. The more evidence we can bombard these people with, the more they will listen to our concerns. One positive note; the new culverts on Coleby Road have considerably improved water flow

## National Lottery Community Grant Allotment mains water

The Council are pleased to announce that grant funding of £7226 has been awarded to enable mains water to be connected to the allotments on Coleby Road. A road closure will be required when the work commences. At the time of going to press, there is no time scale as to when this closure will take place.

#### West Halton hill refuse site

Many residents will have noticed large lorries continually going in and out of the tip on West Halton hill and concerns were raised as to what is happening. Speculation was that plans were being made to extend the solar farm, as official surveying type people had also been spotted. After consulting several agencies, we have received confirmation that the solar farm is not being extended, and the soil was being laid as some areas had become unstable.

#### **HCCP Carbon Capture Pipeline**

Signs have been appearing around both parishes relating to the HCCP project. The signs are relating to an EIA scoping request. The EIA Scoping Report is to allow consultees for feedback on the scope of the proposed assessment of key topics, including traffic, heritage, ecology and agriculture.
