

Flooding LLFA Water Lane Work

A road closure took place at the beginning of June. This was to allow the LLFA team to investigate, jet and map the underground drainage system down Water Lane. Several issues were uncovered during this visit. The teams found it impossible to camera map several areas due to an unknown sluice blocking the drainage system, many tree roots protruding into various channels and several broken drain portions.

The teams returned a week later to carry out extensive works. The PC were not informed about this impending work otherwise we would have advised Water Lane residents. This new visit was to carry out remedial work involving the installation of several new inspection chambers. This will allow the team full access to the drains and will allow them to map the drainage system properly. Once this has been completed the LLFA team will provide the PC with a copy of their report.

Village field wall repairs

We are still actively searching for funding to support the next section of wall mending. The wall is leaning badly in places along Coleby Road and Churchside. For the wall to be rebuilt into a vertical position, soil needs to be dug out on the field side.

However, as a large area of the field is a registered scheduled monument, permission must be sought from Historic England (HE) and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport for any work to take place on the badly damaged sections.

The Parish Council contacted HR however the method statement and scope of works HE insist the council follow is proving prohibitive so sadly some of the more damaged sections of the wall may not get mended

The Council will continue to repair other wall sections which are outside the registered scheduled monument area.

Cemetery Grass cutting

It has come to light that the cemetery on Coleby Road is not registered to West Halton and Coleby Parish Council. The land is in fact owned by North Lincolnshire Council. WH+C PC have been paying for a contractor to cut the grass, and we have been paying rates on the land for the past few years, so this year we have refused to pay the rates

The PC held a meeting with NLC back in Q4 2024 where it was agreed that NLC would transfer the ownership of the land to WH+C PC.

To date this transfer has not happened. NLC are dragging their heels despite us chasing for updates.

Our current contractor charges us £20 per cut. Council has asked NLC to refund this charge and they agreed to refund a total of £190 for the grass cutting season. Up to the end of June, the total costs are already £120.00!!. WH+C PC has agreed that spending resident's precept funds on cutting grass land that does not belong to us is not a cost-effective use of resident's precept funds. Therefore, there may be a time in the future when the cemetery grass may not be cut.

Council appreciates this decision could prove to be controversial. If residents have any concerns over the length of the cemetery grass, please contact NLC.

ST ETHELDREDAS CHURCH

Hello again!

At the last time of going to press, planned work on the south elevation of the chancel wall was about to begin.

We are really pleased to say that the weather in April was excellent for lime mortar work and so all the loose old and inappropriate mortar was removed from the above wall by the stonemason and the joints were repointed. The finished wall looks amazing!

Now that the guttering has been removed, re-levelled and re-fixed, the wall is watertight, and the church is better protected from the elements. Now the interior plasterwork will be able to slowly dry out with a view to re-plastering in the future.

Whist the stonemason was working at church we also were able to get him to do a small repair on the churchyard perimeter wall where the new section of wall built after the fallen tree was cleared, met the existing wall.

Lastly, a new piece of Magnesian Limestone has been carved and fitted to the left-hand side of the porch entrance so that the entrance porch has matching stones once more.

The church services in April, May and June were all led by Rev. David Beverley who has now been doing the services for nearly 5 years whilst we have been without a vicar. The good news is that the Diocese have now placed the advert for a vicar – not just for West Halton – but who will be responsible for several parishes within the area. We await the outcome and will update when we know more.
