It was a difficult 12 months run up to this monstrous, but truly incredible personal achievement – knee problems, continuous doctor appointments but thanks to wonderful ultra medical and physio teams she managed to complete the marathon with lots of little bursts of jogging, side stepping and skipping. She finished in an overall time of 36 hours 40 minutes, 43rd out of 76 and 12th out of 24 ladies. It was extremely hot, with temperatures recording 38 degrees C. Many early starts with breakfast sometimes at 2.30am ready for a 4.30am start. Finally, thanks to extensive excellent care of medical teams bandaging her knee, the last two days she was able to complete without skipping and side stepping however this gave Donna chance to soak in and enjoy the views in the beautiful Wadi Rum. As a serving firefighter Donna completed the ultra-marathon raising money for the firefighter's charity. She has raised just under £1000 so any last-minute donations would be highly appreciated. No donation too small and every little helps towards the charity which assists serving, ex and returned firefighters who put their lives at risk every single day for us all.

Flooding LLFA Water Lane Work

> Repair to damaged section of highway surface drain adjacent to Manor Court entrance

Additional manhole gulley installed to add storage capacity to the system

West Halton Beck cleaned out of rubble, debris etc

ONGO need to carry out extra remedial work on drain root damage

Planning application - Coleby Road

An outline planning application has been submitted to NLC for the possible development of 4 self-build/custom dwellings on land on Coleby Road, West Halton. The piece of land in question is the small paddock, opposite the entrance/exit to Churchside.

Whilst it is recognised that nationally there is a shortage of houses, this selected location does have its challenges. The narrowness of the highway, traffic congestion, the blind exit to Churchside, and surface water drainage are some of the key points to consider. The application was discussed at the October PC meeting and council voted to object to the development.

The consultation end date is 16th October and the application can be viewed via the NLC web page https://ww.northlincs.gov.uk search for planning

News from the allotments

Thank you to everyone's patience whilst the road was closed for 3 days. Having mains water will make such a difference to all the allotment holders during the drier summer months. The system will be drained and switched off October – April inclusive to avoid any freezing or damage to the system

As of January 2025, we will have one vacant allotment. The annual rent is £25, including mains water. If anyone is interested please contact any member of the PC or the clerk

Cemetery ownership transfer

We were hoping by this newsletter that we would have received confirmation that NLC have transferred the ownership to the council – but alas this isn't the case.

NLC claim there are some boundary disputes between land registered on HM Land Registry and actual maps held within NLC Estates. NLC have contacted the Church Commission, but they have been unable to resolve the issue. NLC are now working within their legal department to try and come up with a resolution.

In the meantime, council realises that the decision not to cut the grass has caused some controversy however as stated previously, for your local PC to spend resident's personal precept funds on maintaining property that does not belong to us is not a cost-effective use of public funds.

Moles are infesting the cemetery again – your local council has used precept money in the past for these to be eradicated – total cost ~ £100

The boundary Hedge – your precept money has been used to annually cut this. Each cut costs £250

NLC have even been charging council (YOU – the residents !!) rates for over 20 years on this piece of land – this has amounted to over £200 of your money being un-necessarily paid to NLC. Just think how all these funds could have been spent improving your local community instead of paying it to NLC

NLC have provided council with some more funding, so the cemetery has been cut. This funding however is limited and if the grass continues to grow, once these funds have been exhausted then unfortunately the council contractor will be instructed not to cut the cemetery again.

ST ETHELDREDAS CHURCH

Hello again!

In the last newsletter we highlighted the repair works to the church south chancel wall, the guttering, the churchyard perimeter wall and the porch.

All this work came at a significant cost and was funded by the proceeds from our annual Christmas wreath-making workshops which, over the years have raised over £5000 and enable work such as this to take place. Last year we raised £774 from the workshops towards the repair and restoration of the church.

This year our wreath-making workshops will be held in church on Saturday 6th December. There will be three workshops:

9am – 11am, 12noon – 2pm and 3pm – 5pm

The workshops are very popular, and places fill up quickly. All materials and tuition are included in the £20 workshop cost.
